
Watershed Notes

The old saying about April showers sure was 100% accurate this year! Here are a couple of panoramic shots of our Willamette as it spread out into its floodplain at Riverview Park on April 11. Knowing that this would happen fairly frequently, the City of Independence designed these areas to accommodate flooding and hold the excess water as it slowly recedes back into the main channel. This helps to limit erosion and more severe flooding downstream. Floodwaters also deposit nutrient-rich sediment onto the land, recharge groundwater, and provide important habitat for young fish and other aquatic life. Just another great illustration of how our community, its lands and its rivers are all interconnected!





Temperature Monitoring season set to begin in May!



We are happy to report that our request for grant funding for our Stream Temperature Monitoring Program has been awarded this month by the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board (OWEB)! LWC Monitoring Coordinator, Caleb Price, has been busy preparing for the upcoming monitoring season, which begins with the deployment of our temperature loggers in early May. A total of 30 of these hot dog-sized devices will be placed throughout the watershed in areas identified by our NetMap software as having good potential for high-quality salmon and trout habitat, and where we have permission from the landowner. From May to October, the devices will record the water temperature every hour, giving us a snapshot of how stream temperature changes around the watershed through the hottest part

of the year. Because water temperatures above 18°C can be stressful for salmon and trout, gathering information about stream temperature helps us target the areas that have the most potential for successful restoration efforts.
